

Annals of GIS

The journal has been published since 1995 and until 2008 it had been published under the title *Geographic Information Sciences*. In 2009 it changed to *Annals of GIS*. It is the official organ of the international association of Chinese experts in geoinformation sciences and its publisher is *Francis & Taylor*. Up to 2009 two volumes had been published annually and later four. The editorial board has been inviting authors to publish their original ideas on theory, methods, development and applications in the field of geoinformation science. The articles are expected from the following fields:

- remote sensing and data acquisition
- geoinformation systems
- geovisualization and virtual geographic environments
- spatial analysis and modelling
- uncertainty modelling.
