

and Vienna was held through friendships with state chancellor Kaunitz and Karl Scherffer, a Jesuit monk and physicist at the University of Vienna. A memorial plaque in honour of Bošković was set up on the outside wall of the Academy of Sciences in Vienna, situated on Dr. Ignaz Seipel Square. The inscription on the plaque reads that Croatian scientist Ruđer Bošković lived there from 1756 to 1760 and in 1763. The memorial plaque was raised on the initiative of the Museum of Technology.

The last interesting site related to geodesy we visited in Vienna is located in St. Steven's Cathedral. There is a memorial plate on the floor of the cathedral, in front of St. Catherine's Chapel. The plate marks the origin of the cadastral survey coordinate system. The following text is written on it in German:

Coordinate origin
of cadastral survey of Empire and
Kingdom
from 1817 to 1837
for crown counties Lower Austria,
Moravia, Silesia and Dalmatia
longitude: $\lambda = 34^\circ 02' 27,32''$ east of
Ferro,
latitude: $\varphi = 48^\circ 12' 31,54''$

Works on the trigonometric network in the Viennese Coordinate System for cadastral purposes started in 1817 and finished in 1821. The baseline Leopoldsberg Kuppel-Hundsheimerberg was taken from the trigonometric network of the Military-Geographic Institute, determined between 1806 and 1808, with a length of 24717.391 Viennese fathoms. This baseline length was calculated starting from the Wiener Neustadt baseline, surveyed by Liesganig in 1762.

The entire coordinate system is oriented using the St. Stephen Leopoldsberg baseline, with the azimuth determined by astronomer Ritter von Bürg, which is $\alpha = 165^\circ 55' 22,0''$, calculating from South over West, as it was done at the time in those old coordinate systems. The trigonometric network was connected with the trigonometric network in the Krim Coordinate System and the trigonometric network in Dalmatia.

SDI Days

Zagreb, 25 – 29 September, 2012



NSDI and INSPIRE Days and Cartography and Geoinformation Conferences are traditionally organized every year. Three NSDI and INSPIRE Days and Cartography and Geoinformation Conferences have been organized so far: Varaždin (2009), Opatija (2010) and Split (2011). The Regional INSPIRE Training and Forum organized by EU INSPIRATION Project was also included this year. The Spatial Data Infrastructure (SDI) Days were organized by:

SDI Days were held in the Hotel International in Zagreb, September 25th – 29th, 2012. SDI Days included training, conferences and social events:

- 2nd Regional INSPIRE Training, September 25th - 26th, 2012,
- 1st Regional INSPIRE Forum and 4th Croatian NSDI and INSPIRE Day, September 27th, 2012,
- 8th Cartography and Geoinformation Conference, September 28th, 2012,

- Tour to Hrvatsko Zagorje, September 29th, 2012.

SDI Days had several auspices, partners, supporting organizations and donors. General Conference auspices were Ministry of Construction and Physical Planning of the Republic of Croatia and NSDI Council of the Government of the Republic of Croatia. The Minister of Construction and Physical Planning, Mr. Ivan Vrdoljak opened SDI Days. SDI Days were supported by European Commission Joint Research Centre (JRC), International Cartographic Association (ICA), International Federation of Surveyors (FIG), EuroSDR and Croatian Academy

knjiga *Theoria Philosophiae Naturalis* prvi put je izdana u Beču 1758. godine. Povezanost Boškovića i Beča održavala su i prijateljstva s državnim kancelarom Kaunitzom i Karлом Scherfflerom, isusovačkim fratrom i fizičarom na Sveučilištu u Beču. Boškoviću u čast na vanjskom zidu zgrade Akademije znanosti u Beču, koja je smještena na Trgu doktora Ignaza Seipela, postavljena je spomen-ploča. Na njoj piše da je tu stanovaao hrvatski znanstvenik Ruđer Bošković od 1756-60 i 1763, a ploču je podigao Tehnički muzej.

Posljednja zanimljivost vezana uz geodeziju koju smo pogledali u Beču nalazi se u katedrali sv. Stjepana. U katedrali na podu ispred kapele sv. Katerine smještena je spomen-ploča na kojoj je označena točka ishodišta koordinatnog sustava katastarske izmjere. Na njoj na njemačkom jeziku piše:

od 1817. do 1837. godine
za zemlje krune Donju Austriju,
Moravsku, Šlesku i Dalmaciju
geografska dužina: $\lambda = 34^{\circ}02'27,32''$
istočno od Ferra
geografska širina: $\varphi = 48^{\circ}12'31,54''$

Radovi na trigonometrijskoj mreži u Bečkom koordinatnom sustavu za katastarske potrebe započeli su 1817. godine, a završeni 1821. Osnovna strana Leopoldsberg Kuppel-Hundsheimerberg uzeta je iz trigonometrijske mreže Vojnogeografskog instituta, koja je određena između 1806. i 1808. godine, a njezina je duljina 24717,391 bečkih hvati. Ta duljina stranice izračunana je polazeći od osnovice kraj Wiener Neustadta (Bečkog Novog Mjesta), koju je izmjerio

Liesganing 1762. godine. Čitav koordinatni sustav orijentiran je s pomoću strane Sv. Stjepan-Leopoldsberg, čiji je azimut odredio astronom Ritter von Bürg, a koji iznosi $\alpha = 165^{\circ} 55' 22,0''$, računajući ga od juga preko zapada, kao što se to činilo tada u tim starim koordinatnim sustavima. Na tu trigonometrijsku mrežu bila je naslovnjena trigonometrijska mreža u Krimskom koordinatnom sustavu, a zatim trigonometrijska mreža u Dalmaciji.


