The *Polish Cartographical Review* (PCR) journal has been published in English four times a year since 2015. The journal is in open access and it is published by De Gruyter Open. It is edited by Polish scientists in collab-


oration with international experts. The journal is the successor of *Polski Przegląd Kartograficzny*, which had been published since 1969 so the 2015 issue of the journal is English is volume no. 47. The *Polski Przegląd Kartograficzny* journal website (<http://ppk.net.pl/akcja1.php>) states that two issues are going to be published each year in Polish in addition to the journal in English. The journal in Polish is going to contain additional content: Notes, Reviews, Discussions, Chronicles and Cartographic literature news. Two issues from 2016 have already been published at the website.

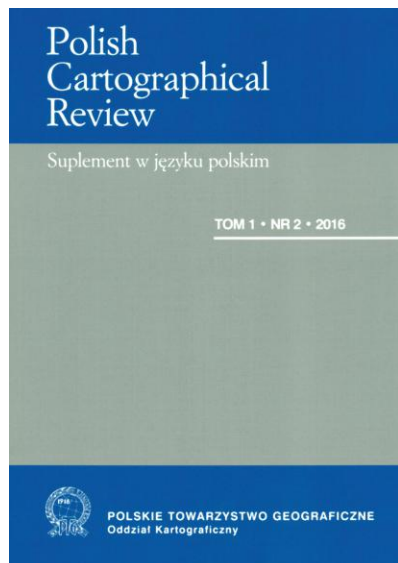
SCHOLARLY WRITING AWARD
